CNA Course Details:

- Fall and Spring CNA classes are offered at the Collin College Celina, Technical, and Wylie Campuses. Summer CNA classes are on offered at the Technical and Wylie Campuses.
- The CNA lecture, lab and clinical rotations are all conducted within the timeframe of the scheduled course.
- Course schedules vary depending on the campus and the semester, ranging from 7 to 16 weeks in length.

What will I learn?

NURA 1301 Nurse Aide for Health Care (3 Credit Hours)

- Knowledge, skills and abilities essential to provide basic care to residents of long-term care facilities.
- Resident's rights, communication, safety, observation, reporting and assisting residents in maintaining basic comfort and safety.
- Emphasis is on effective interaction with members of the health care team, restorative services, mental health and social service needs.

NURA 1160 Clinical – Nursing Aide (1 Credit Hour)

- A health-related work-based learning experience that enables the student to apply specialized occupational theory, skills and concepts.
- Direct supervision is provided by the clinical instructor.
- Prerequisite: NURA 1301 or consent of Program Director.
- NOTE: All students are required to provide their own reliable transportation to and from clinical rotation sites.

Where can I work?

CNA's can work at nursing homes, home health agencies, long-term care facilities and some hospitals.



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
