
Montessori/Early Childhood Education

Structured learning in early childhood can be the key to an exceptional life for students' later years. Continuing Education courses based on Montessori techniques can be your key to helping develop those young minds. Based on the traditional concepts developed by Dr. Maria Montessori, Collin College's 120-hour certification program focuses on classroom management, child development, and Montessori philosophy. Courses explore ways to help children build independence and self-confidence, learn their five senses, develop the fundamentals of language and mathematics, and introduce them to concepts like geography and culture.

Professional Truck Driving (CDL)

Put your hands on the wheel of an in-demand career! Companies are looking for Commercial Driver's License (CDL) drivers. Collin College Continuing Education offers start-to-finish training for students who want to obtain a CDL. The college's Professional Truck Driving program includes the in-class preparation needed to obtain a permit plus the hours of driving required for the license. Before starting classes, students must obtain a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical. The college provides the rest. You must register for both CDL I and II (200 hours), which prepare students for mastery of the CDL written examination.

English as a Second Language


The ability to communicate
