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**Course Number:** ACNT 7020

**Course Title:** General Accounting Basic

**Course Description:** This course provides a broad overview of financial and managerial accounting. Topics include accounting concepts and terms, primary financial statements, chart of accounts, managerial accounting including job order and process costing, CVP analysis, absorption & variable costing, activity based costing and standard costing. Balanced Scorecard analysis is also reviewed.

**Student Learning Outcomes:**

Be familiar with Accounting Concepts and understand the Importance of Financial Reports

Be familiar with the Balance Sheet Equation (net worth statement)

Draw out the Cash Cycle for a business

List the similarities and differences between corporations, partnerships and sole proprietorships

Identify the primary financial statements and how they are created; an income statement, statement of retained earnings, and a balance sheet

Create a typical Chart of Accounts

Analyze common business transactions and determine the appropriate accounts to debit or credit

Be familiar with terms, concepts and classifications related to Managerial Accounting

Identify the differences between Managerial and financial accounting

Explain Job Order Costing and Process Costing at a high level, and understand what types of business would use each

Explain Absorption and Variable Costing at a high level, and understand when a business would use each

Explain how and when Activity Based Costing would be used

Explain Standard Costing and Benchmark analysis
