Course Title: Korean II

Course Description: Continuing from Korean I, this beginner course aims to enable students to improve their communication skills in Korean by motivating their interest in learning the Korean language based on cross-cultural communication. Through interactive practices, students can use the language actively, and develop communication skills.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Korean I

Course Resources: Textbook (required): Sejong Korean 1A: English Edition; Kong & Park, 9781635190434

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of the course, students will be able to conduct simple conversations. Learn essential everyday phrases for asking and answering questions, suggesting, vocabulary and expressions for places and food, native Korean numbers, dates and days of the week, weather and seasons, weekend activities, and plans.

Course Sessions: Listed are guidelines to indicate all topics that will be covered during your course. Do not plan your personal calendar based on these sessions. Your instructor will give you a calendar for your class that will indicate specific topics, assignments, and days.

Lesson Plan:

Sessions 1, 2, 3, 4: Buying Things (I buy bread and milk, Give me five apples)

Sessions 5, 6, 7, 8: Time and Weather (It begins at seven o'clock, Is the weather hot?)

Sessions 9, 10, 11, 12: Weekend Activities (I took a walk in the park, Shall we go to an amusement park together?)
