It was an emotional experience for me because I have always been the only disabled student in my dance classes. After seeing AXIS Dance Company perform, I wanted to know more; I thought: Wow, here is a world of dance that I did not realize existed." After returning from the dance intensive, Devin says "I now know dance is truly universal. It does not matter if you are disabled.
