| _PURCHASING AUTHORITY | The Board delegates to the CollegeDistrict President or designee the authority to determine the method of purchasing, in accordance with CF(LEGAL), and to make budgeted purchases. <u>All purchases</u> valued at \$50,000 or more shall be taken to the Board for approval. <u>This policy applies to the purchase of tangible property and/or ser- vices.</u> | |
| GENERAL POLICY | The Board gives critical attention to the purchase of goods and ser- vices by the College. In each case, the Board seeks to accept the lowest responsible bid that represents the best value for the Col- lege after considering all legal permissible factors in awarding a contract. In determining the best value, the Board shall act faith- fully and exercise its best judgment to best serve the interests of the College and shall always exercise its honest discretion in seek- ing to accomplish the objective sought. The College shall strictly comply with all laws governing the purchase of goods and ser- vices. Bids determined to be unsatisfactory may be rejected by ad- ministrative or Board action as appropriate. | |
| COMPETITIVE BIDDING | If competitive bidding is chosen as the purchasing method, the Dis- trict President or designee shall prepare bid specifications for items/services to be purchased. Bids may be submitted electroni- cally or in sealed envelopes prior to the close date and time as in- dicated in the invitation to bid. Bidders may view the bid tabulation electronically immediately after the invitation to bid is unsealed or may attend a public bid opening in the College's purchasing office. Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled date and time for closing. Bids received after the specified time shall not be consid- ered. No material changes may be made to a bid once it is submit- ted. The College may reject any or all bids and waive technicalities or informalities in the solicitation process as deemed to be in the best | |
| COMPETITIVE SEALED PROPOSALS | Informalities in the solicitation process as deemed to be in the best interest of the College. If competitive sealed proposals are chosen as the purchasing method, the District President or designee shall prepare the re- quest for proposals and/or specifications for items/services to be purchased. Proposals may be submitted electronically or in sealed envelopes prior to the close date and time as indicated in the re- quest for proposal. Proposals received after the specified time shall not be considered. The name of all proposers submitting pro- posals will be available online at the time that the request for pro- posal is unsealed or proposers may attend a public proposal open- ing to hear the name of those companies submitting proposals. Proposals may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time for clos- ing. Changes in the content of a proposal, and in prices, may be negotiated after proposals are opened. | |

PURCHASING AND ACQUISITION

| | The College may reject any or all proposals and waive technicali- ties or informalities in the solicitation process as deemed to be in the best interest of the College. |
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| ELECTRONIC BIDS OR PROPOSALS | Bids or proposals that the College accepts through electronic transmission shall be administered in accordance with administra- tive regulations. Such regulations shall safeguard the integrity of the competitive procurement process; ensure the identification, se- curity, and confidentiality of electronic bids or proposals; and en- sure that the electronic bids or proposals remain effectively uno- pened until the proper time. |
| RESPONSIBILITY FOR DEBTS | The College District shall assume responsibility for debts incurred in the name of the College District so long as those debts are for purchases made in accordance with the adopted budget, state law, Board policy and current College District administrative proce- dures. The College District shall not be responsible for debts in- curred by persons or organizations who are not directly under Board control employees or duly authorized agents of the College District. Persons making unauthorized purchases shall assume full responsibility for all such debts. |
| PURCHASE COMMITMENTS | All purchase commitments shall be made by the <u>District</u> President or designee on a properly drawn and issued purchase document through purchase order, contract, procurement card, or check re- <u>quest</u> , subject to budget availability and in accordance with admin- istrative procedures. |
| PERSONAL PURCHASES | College District employees shall not be permitted to purchase supplies, equipment, or services for personal use through the College's_District's business office. |
| EQUAL OPPORTUNITY | The College encourages participation in the proposal process by small, minority and woman-owned businesses. Collin does not dis- criminate on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, national origin, age, disability or veteran status. |
| DELINQUENT FRANCHISE TAXES | Each corporation contracting with the College shall certify that its franchise taxes are current. If the corporation is exempt from pay- ment of franchise taxes or is an out-of-state corporation not subject to Texas franchise tax, it shall certify a statement to that effect. Making a false statement as to corporate franchise tax status shall be considered a material breach of the contract and shall be grounds for cancellation of the contract. |
