Globe-ular: Model UN team takes on the world



The Collin College Model United Nations team at the National Model United Nations competition in New York City in the spring.

It is a mad, mad world out there, and the Model United Nations team at Collin College is trying to figure it out, one country at a time.

Sonia Iwanek, professor of political science, has been the co-sponsor of the Model United Nations with professor of political science Nick Morgan since 2008.

Since, the delegation has competed on the highest levels in the country at the American Model United Nations in Chicago in the fall and at the National Model United Nations in New York City in the spring.

At both competitions, the Collin College group has returned with numerous awards going against the foremost universities in the nation. At the National Model United Nations competition last spring, Collin College was one of two community colleges to receive some commendation.

“We train them like athletes. We train to be on par or better than the universities,” Iwanek said.

Collin College’s Model United Nations is tied to the “Introduction to Political Science” courses, one section each offered at the Spring Creek and Preston Ridge campuses.

Students must take this course to participate in Model United Nations (and make the team); however, students enrolled in the class do not have to join Model United Nations.

For competitions, each college or university’s delegation is assigned a country. This year, Collin College is the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Up until the

competition, students must study the DRC, its culture, its history, the intricacies of its governmental system, voting systems and foreign policy.

Awards are bestowed upon delegations and individuals who are able to best represent their specific country's interest in votes and interactions with other "countries."

Not only does Collin College hold its own in competitions, but students tend to find success after transferring.

"Most of our students usually go on to a major university; most go to Southern Methodist University. We continue to stock the SMU Model UN," Iwanek said. Other Model United Nations students have gone on to Harvard University, Columbia University, Cornell University, and find jobs with the U.S. Foreign Services and the real United Nations with UNICEF.

Iwanek is quick to point out that not all Model United Nations students are political science students. Some have backgrounds in biology, other natural sciences and disciplines. However, she thinks these students provide a unique perspective and expertise when representing a country. She also thinks the science students gain important skills.

"The two major takeaways are learning to work in a team-building atmosphere and public speaking. The whole point (of Model United Nations) is to come to a consensus and to learn how to make compromises when they think this one policy isn't going to benefit them," Iwanek said. "Science students also learn how to speak in public. They are forced to explain and highlight, with confidence, why something is important. I've seen a lot of them develop those communication skills that in the sciences they may not work on."

Overall, students gain a new perspective not only with global issues, but also how the United States' policies affect other countries, positively or negatively.

"A lot of times, there is a U.S.-centered approach to everything," Iwanek said. "Students may not think about all of our policies on a global scale and how we live in a global community. Whatever country we represent, they have to take on that role, even if it's anti-American. A lot of students have struggled with this. It forces you to take on a position and fight for it. At the end, there's an expansion of tolerance."



Theater alum joins hit TV show

A former Collin College student is in on the "gossip."

Brian J. Smith, former theatre student, has been added to the cast of the CW's hit show, *Gossip Girl*.

Smith will take on the role of Blake Lively's Serena van der Woodsen's new love interest. His character will be part of a six-episode storyline starting in September.

At Collin College, Smith was the breakout star of the productions of *A Clockwork Orange* and *Romeo and Juliet*. The Allen resident graduated from The Juilliard School and has seen his acting stock take off the last couple of years.

Smith's portrays Lieutenant Matthew Scott in the Syfy channel's *Stargate Universe* in addition to a role on the cable film, *Red Faction: Origins*.

Smith also was in PBS' Masterpiece Theatre remake of *Murder on the Orient Express* and an off-Broadway play, *The Little Black Dress*.

"I think there is no better place to start than Collin College. People get accepted to expensive theater programs and are not happy. I wish I had gone to Collin College first and got the base and good advice and guidance," Smith said. "When you look at the success rate coming out of Collin College—it is head and shoulders ahead of expensive colleges—that says a lot about the faculty. You can make millions and have big houses and have people that will stroke your ego, and at the end of the day it will not matter. What is important is what you have said as a human being through your work."

Smith joins other former theatre students who have found success in front of the camera.

Michael Urie, who also went to Juilliard, achieved fame as Marc St. James on the ABC show, *Ugly Betty*, and as Rudi Gernreich in the off-Broadway

play, *The Temperamentals*.
