- Additional campus police officers have been added, with more hirings planned
- Goal: Minimum of two officers per shift, per campus, 24/7
- A comprehensive emergency response plan has been updated
- Future campus upgrades include PA systems, solar-powered emergency phones, and surveillance cameras in remote parking areas
- Training initiatives and/or personal safety classes will be available for staff and students
