As we near the end of the Spring semester, here is the latest from Collin College.

1. New Farmersville Campus now open to the public; ribbon cutting and open house event planned

- Students in the eastern part of Collin County have started taking a limited number of classes at the new Farmersville Campus.
- The campus ribbon cutting will be held on **Saturday, May 22** at **10 a.m.** with a community open house afterward.
- The new campus is located at **501 S. Collin Parkway, Farmersville.**

2. Capital One \$30,000 grant to help improve college's digital presence at the Plano Campus (Spring Creek)

- Plano Campus Writing Center Manager Rebecka Scott and Academic Affairs Dean Dr. Meredith Wang were awarded a **\$30,000 grant from Capital One** for the Anthony Peterson Center for Academic Assistance (APCAA) to improve its digital presence through an embedded Canvas course and to pilot a new online appointment and tutoring platform.
- Through this grant, the APCAA hopes to enhance academic support, student success, and retention for online courses ahead of the opening of iCollin in the fall.
- In collaboration with instructional designers, district APCAA managers, the eCollin Learning Center, Executive Dean of iCollin Dr. Sarah Lee, and Webmaster Heather Webb-Losh, Scott created a supplemental Canvas

course for the Plano Writing Center. The course is being piloted in Spring 2021 as an embedded services resource link in Plano Campus Web English composition courses. The composition courses currently serve more than 1,000 students.
