1. Collin College to offer new Cloud Computing degree

- The college was approved by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to offer an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Cloud Computing Infrastructure beginning this fall.
- The two-year program is built upon knowledge domains and skills developed by local, state, and national committees as well as input from industry experts in the college's Cloud Computing Advisory Committee.



- Many courses in the new program will tie in with in-demand industry certifications, such as Amazon Web Services (AWS) and Microsoft Azure.
- After completing the AAS degree in Cloud Computing Infrastructure, students can transfer all 60 credit hours into a four-year degree.

2. Collin College celebrates ROSE Award nominees and finalists

- The Collin College Staff Council recently announced the nominees and finalists for the 2020-2021 ROSE Award. All of the nominees were celebrated in a special ceremony on June 16.
- The staff award program, Recognition of Service and Excellence (ROSE), recognizes excellence and extraordinary effort demonstrated by fulland part-time staff members who exemplify our Core Values of Learning, Service and Involvement, Creativity and Innovation, Academic Excellence, Dignity and Respect, and Integrity.



• The winner will be announced at **All College Day on Friday, Aug. 13.** The winners will receive a crystal plaque and beautiful yellow roses. The full-time ROSE Award winner will also receive a reserved parking space at his or her primary campus for a year.

4. Collin College tennis player named All-American

- The title "All-American" is given to student athletes who finish in the top 10 players in singles play as ranked by the ITA, the governing body of college tennis in the United States.
- Bednarczuk, originally from Lublin, Poland, ranked fourth in singles play nationally.
- The honor tops a strong season for Collin College's men's and women's tennis teams, both of which finished in the **top 15 nationally.**
