



Dean of Students Office Disciplinary Penalties

A student will be subject to discipline for violations of Collin College policies and procedures, including the rules outlining expectations for student conduct. If a student commits an infraction or engages in misconduct, Collin College may impose one (1) or more of the following penalties:

1. Reprimand
2. Restitution
3. Scholastic Penalty (Issued by Instructor)
4. Educational Project Experience (EPE)
5. Conditional Probation
6. Suspension
7. Expulsion

Accepting or Appealing Disciplinary Penalties:

The student has the right to accept the administrative decision of the dean of students or designee. A student who chooses to accept the administrative decision will sign an *Acceptance of the Administrative Decision Statement*. Once this statement is signed, the administrative decision will be final, binding, and the student will not be allowed to appeal that decision. The student will be expected to comply with all disciplinary penalties and obligations set forth in the administrative decision.

The student has the right to appeal the administrative decision of the dean of students or designee to the Disciplinary Appeals Committee (DAC). If the student chooses to appeal the administrative decision, they must submit the *Disciplinary Appeal Request Form* contained in the administrative decision documents on or before the tenth College District business day following the administrative decision. The DAC will be convened to hear the case.

The DAC's decision may be appealed to the designated Leadership Team member. The designated Leadership Team member's decision is final and non-appealable, except when Expulsion is recommended by the dean of students or designee and/or the DAC and affirmed by the designated Leadership Team Member.

Solely in the case where Expulsion is recommended and affirmed, a student may appeal to the College District President or designee. The College District President or designee's decision is final and non-appealable. Unless otherwise specified in writing, Expulsion will have College District-wide effect, and an expelled student may not enroll for admission to any campus without the College District President or designee's approval unless the student's petition to revoke the Expulsion is approved.

Suspended or Expelled Students:

No former student who has been suspended or expelled from Collin College for disciplinary reasons will be permitted on the campus or other facilities of Collin College, initiated into an honorary or service organization, or permitted to receive credit for academic work done in residence or by correspondence or extension during the period of Suspension or Expulsion without the prior written approval of the appropriate administrator or the Board of Trustees (Board).

Petition to Revoke Expulsion:

Once five (5) calendar years from the date of the College District President or designee's decision have expired, the student may petition to revoke the Expulsion. Contact the Dean of Students Office at 972.881.5604 or dos@collin.edu to request an *Expulsion Revocation Form*.
