If so, please provide the following information listed below and allow two weeks for review and processing, **prior to scheduling your exam.**

CLEP (College Level Examination Program)

The CLEP is a group of standardized tests created and administered by College Board. Students who take CLEP may earn college credit in twenty-eight subject areas without taking college courses. (Collin accepts all Subject Exams, but not the General Exams)

TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills)

The TEAS is a test for prospective nursing students that outlines their academic skills in the areas of: Reading, Math, Science, and English and Language Usage.

PSB (Psychological Services Bureau)

THE PSB Examination is specifically designed for those students entering education programs for health professions. The PSB Exam is comprised of a series of tests that measure abilities, knowledge, and attitudes considered important for successful performance in a health program.

HiSET (High School Equivalency Test)

The HiSET is a high school equivalency exam, and covers the following five subjects: Language Arts: Reading and Writing, Science, Mathematics, and Social Studies.

TSI (Texas Success Initiative)

The TSI is an untimed state wide placement exam designed to determine if a student is ready for college-level course work in the general areas of reading, writing and mathematics.
