Probation Officers and Correctional Treatment Specialists Avg. Starting Salary: \$60,400 Average Salary: \$83,200 Projected Job Growth: 21.9%

Private Detectives and Investigators Avg. Starting Salary: \$35,800 Average Salary: \$69,100 Projected Job Growth: 26.2%
