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Course Number: ITSE 1042 - Intermediate Programming Languages

Course Title: Data Science - Programming

Course Description: Explore data pull with SQL, manipulation with Python and R programming languages and creation of data visualizations.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Basic ability to use a code editor, exposure to programming in any language – beyond the beginner level. Instructor approval.

Course Resources: Student must bring personal laptop computer for use in class. Installation of Anaconda Distribution for Python/R and SQLite3 will be covered in Session 1.

Student Learning Outcomes: Demonstrate the ability to pull data with SQL and manipulate data with Python and R programming languages and generate visualizations.
