Introductory Educational Courses

EDUC 1301 – Introduction to the Teaching Profession

This course includes early field observations at all levels of P-12 schools with varied and diverse student populations to introduce students to, and allow analysis of, the culture of schooling and classrooms.

EDUC 2301 – Introduction to Special Populations

Provides an overview of schooling and classrooms from the perspectives of language, gender, socioeconomic status, ethnic and academic diversity, and equity with an emphasis on factors that facilitate learning.

Each AAT requires General Education Core of 42 credit hours, six hours of education-specific classes and 12 hours of subject matter related to grades being taught.
