You can help people breathe easier as a Respiratory Therapist. The role respiratory therapists play in critical care can be fast-paced, challenging, and personally rewarding. They are responsible for airway care, ventilator management, and patient monitoring, working with a team to keep their patients breathing. Respiratory therapists work in various healthcare-related areas, including emergency departments, intensive care units, neonatal and pediatric units, operating rooms, skilled nursing facilities, and more. They provide general care through oxygen therapy, volume augmentation, and other treatments.
