Course Title: Contract Documents & Requirements

Course Description: Identify Contract Documents. Read, interpret and understand construction contracts, contract language, terms, clauses and exhibits. Understand contract compliance, the ramifications of default and enforceability. Review the various types of owner contracts, subcontracts, purchase orders, change orders, change directives, supplemental instructions. Understand bonding and insurance requirements. Customize subcontracts to comply with owner specific contract language and terms.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Blueprint Reading & CSI Master Format, The Bidding Process and General Conditions and relevant experience in commercial construction or commercial real estate development.
