### COURSE INFORMATION

**Course Number:** CONS 7920

**Course Title:** OSHA 10 Hour Construction Safety

**Course Description:** Exploration of major safety issues that affect the workplace, including general safety awareness, loss control and regulatory compliance.

**Suggested Course Prerequisite(s):** Student must have high school diploma and be able to write and speak English fluently.

**Course Resources:** N/A

**Student Learning Outcomes:** Identify legal record keeping and components of the safety program for various industries as required. Demonstrate ability to predict, identify and prevent, possible common worksite hazards.

1. Identify personal protective equipment. Identify common electrical hazards.
2. Understand the importance of scaffolding and fall protection for workers in elevated workplaces.
3. Recognize the hazards associated with working in or around excavation sites.
4. Understand the requirements for fire protection in the workplace.

**Certification Notes:** Successful completion results in issuance of 10-hour OSHA card.

**Lesson Plan – by week or session:**

**Session 1:** Introduction to OSHA; Walking and Working Surfaces; Exit Routes, Emergency Action Plans, and Fire Prevention

**Session 2:** Electrical; Personal Protective Equipment; Hazard Communication

**Session 3:** Materials Handling; Machine Guarding

**Course Sessions:** Listed are a guideline to indicate all topics that will be covered during your course. Do not plan your personal calendar based on these sessions. Your instructor will give you a calendar for your class that will indicate specific topics, assignments, and days.

**Method of Evaluation:** Unless otherwise stated, course completion is evaluated on the basis of attendance. Students must be in attendance 90% of each course in a certificate series for successful completion and to earn a certificate as specified.
