Course Title: Spanish Conversation - Intermediate

Course Description:

Continue to reinforce your Spanish learning experience with this supplemental conversation course. Active participation in listening and conversation exercises will allow you; the student, to expand your vocabulary, use tenses appropriately and work on pronunciation. Designed to complement Spanish Levels III or IV.
