Course Title: Spanish Conversation - Advanced

Course Description:

This intensive, interactive conversation class will emphasize listening and speaking skills in preparation to achieve oral proficiency.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Enrollment in Spanish V or above

Course Objectives:

1. Increase ability to read and discuss authentic literary works as frames of reference in a business or industry-related setting.
2. Develop speaking skills, oral presentations for business situations.
3. Expand vocabulary for use in a business and industry-related setting.
4. Improve ability to express correctly in Spanish.
5. Increase listening comprehension skills.
6. Increase critical-thinking skills.
