**Course Title:** Genealogy II

**Course Description:** Build on the methods introduced in the basic course to further acquaint the student with original records sources, and to enhance skills in interpreting, extracting, transcribing and abstracting records, research planning, analyzing evidence and documenting research. Course includes reading a published case study and an assigned class project. Course is designed for those who have completed the basic course, those returning to genealogy, or for the researcher seeking professional credentials
