Course Number: PHOT 6830

Course Title: Architectural and Landscape Photography

Course Description: Learn the fundamental skills of Architectural and Landscape Photography. Students will learn various methods and camera settings for capturing detailed images of Architectural structures and Landscape sceneries. They will learn about camera equipment and accessories options. Topics will range from daytime landscape sceneries vs. nighttime, architectural interior vs. exterior, and post processing editing techniques.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Digital Photography - Intermediate Skills

Course Resources: Textbook

Student Learning Outcomes: Learn how to photograph various landscape sceneries by determining best time-of-day, direction, and season. Learn how to photograph various architectural structures and understand lens perspective, converging lines, and image warping. Demonstrate camera settings, optional accessories, and equipment requirements. Learn about software editing techniques and plug-ins options.

Lesson Plan – by week or session:

- Session 1: Architectural and Landscape introduction. Camera equipment, gear and accessories. Understanding Locations vs Timing
- Session 2: Landscape Locations, Time of Day, Seasons, Directions, and Equipment.
- Session 3: Architecture Building & Structures. Interior & Exteriors,
- Session 4: On Campus Field Trip
- **Session 5**: Post Processing RAW vs JPEG files. Software Options, Plugins. Display options, Web Print, and Mobile devices.

Method of Evaluation: Unless otherwise stated, course completion is evaluated on the basis of attendance. Students must be in attendance 90% of the class time in order to be considered a successful completer of the course.

Students must be in attendance 90% of each course in a certificate series for successful completion and to earn a certificate as specified.

Students must complete all courses (core and no. of elective courses needed) to complete a certificate series within two years from start date of the first course taken.
