Course Title: Fashion Photography

Course Description Fashion photography is a genre of photography which is devoted to displaying clothing and other fashion items. Fashion photography is most often conducted for advertisements or fashion magazines.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Digital Photography - Advanced, or be well versed in basic photography concepts including shooting in Manual Mode, and setting the exposure using Aperture Value (Aperture Priority) and Time Value (Shutter Priority).

Demonstrate the necessary camera and lighting skill and composition techniques to achieve the fashion look desired by the fashion industry.
