Course Title: AngularJS Framework

Course Description: Advanced JavaScript course introducing the AngularJS (1 & 2) Framework(s) to enhance web design and applications. The course will cover the theory and practice of AngularJS (1 & 2), including installing the working environment and example coding. The course includes a review of HTML, CSS, JavaScript, and Bootstrap as a foundation to the theory of Object Oriented Programming (MVC). The student will gain a solid understanding of how this framework is used in industry.

Suggested Course Prerequisite(s): Introduction to JavaScript, or equivalent experience.
