



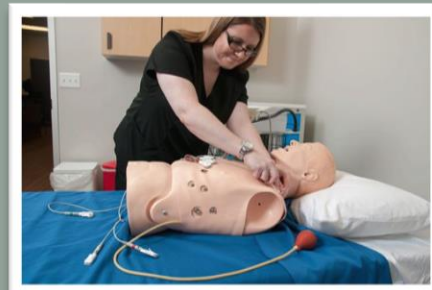

EKG Program Details:

- The EKG Program begins each fall semester.
- Courses are currently only available at the Technical Campus in Allen and meet Monday and Wednesday evenings.
- Coursework is required to be completed in both online and in-person formats.

NOTE: While lecture/lab times are scheduled, clinical rotation schedules vary and will be scheduled outside of the regularly scheduled class time. Please be sure that you have some availability in your schedule during the week between March and May so that you are able to complete your required clinical rotation hours.

What will I learn?

DSAE 2303 Cardiovascular Concepts (48 contact hours)

- Anatomy, physiology, and pathophysiology of the cardiovascular system.
- Focuses on cardiac and vascular structural anatomy and relationships, electrical innervation, embryology, and hemodynamics of the heart and vascular system.

DSAE 1340 Diagnostic Electrocardiography (80 contact hours)

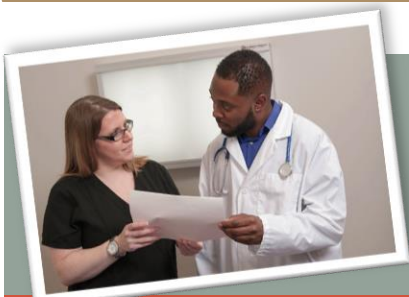
- Cardiac testing including the techniques and interpretation of patient physical assessment.
- Covers electrocardiography, stress testing, Holter monitoring, vital signs, and cardiovascular pharmacology.

DSAE 1315 Principles of Adult Echocardiography (64 contact hours)

- A partnership course with the Diagnostic Medical Sonography department.
- Topics include anatomical correlation of 2-D, M-Mode, and Doppler sonographic imaging.

HPRS 1160 Clinical – Health Sciences, General (48 hours)

- Clinical rotations in a variety of settings, including the emergency rooms and cardiology offices.



Where can I work and how much will I make?

EKG Technicians can work at hospitals, cardiac care facilities, clinics, or any other healthcare facility that utilizes EKGs on their patients/clients.

Newly certified EKG technicians will make an average of \$13/hour.
