## What will I learn?

#### DSAE 2303 Cardiovascular Concepts (3 credit hours)

- Anatomy, physiology, and pathophysiology of the cardiovascular system.
- Focuses on cardiac and vascular structural anatomy and relationships, electrical innervation, embryology, and hemodynamics of the heart and vascular system.

#### DSAE 1340 Diagnostic Electrocardiography (3 credit hours)

- Cardiac testing including the techniques and interpretation of patient physical assessment.
- Covers electrocardiography, stress testing, Holter monitoring, vital signs, and cardiovascular pharmacology.

#### HPRS 2310 Basic Health Skills II (3 credit hours)

• Lecture and simulated laboratory experiences prepare the student to communicate effectively in a patient care environment.
