What will I learn?

NURA 1401 Nurse Aide for Health Care (4 Credit Hours)

- Knowledge, skills and abilities essential to provide basic care to residents of long-term care facilities.
- Resident's rights, communication, safety, observation, reporting and assisting residents in maintaining basic comfort and safety.
- Emphasis is on effective interaction with members of 0 the health care team, restorative services, mental health and social service needs.

NURA 1160 Clinical – Nursing Aide (1 Credit Hour)

- A health-related work-based learning experience that enables the student to apply specialized occupational theory, skills and concepts.
- Direct supervision is provided by the clinical instructor.
- Prerequisite: NURA 1401 or consent of Program Director.
- o <u>NOTE</u>: All students are required to provide their own reliable transportation to and from clinical rotation sites.
