<u>Code</u>	<u>Explanation</u>
NEW	New Student – All new students to Collin will default to NEW status. These students are considered to be in Good Standing and will be eligible for aid (academically speaking) for the semester posted.
GS	Good Standing - Student is making satisfactory academic progress and is eligible for aid (academically speaking) at this time.
WGP	Warning GPA – If a student is in a current status of "Good Standing" and at the end of the enrollment period (semester) falls below the standard for GPA, the student will be placed on "Warning" for the next period of enrollment. Students on warning are still able to receive the financial aid they would otherwise be eligible to receive. (Warning statuses do NOT apply to complete withdrawals.)
WPC	Warning Percent Completion – If a student is in a current status of "Good Standing" and at the end of the enrollment period (semester) fails to meet the standard for Completion, the student will be placed on "Warning" for the next period of enrollment. Students on warning are still able to receive the financial aid they would otherwise be eligible to receive. (Warning statuses do NOT apply to complete withdrawals.)
WGPPC	Warning GPA & Percent Completion – If a student is in a current status of "Good Standing" and at the end of the enrollment period (semester) fails to meet the standards for both GPA and Completion, the student will be placed on "Warning" for the next period of enrollment. Students on warning are still able to receive the financial aid they would otherwise be eligible to

receive. (Warning statuses do **NOT** apply to complete

withdrawals.)

SGP

Suspension GPA – If a student is in a current status of "Warning" and at the end of the enrollment period (semester) falls below the standard for GPA, the student will automatically be placed on financial aid suspension and will no longer be eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

SPC

Suspension Percent Completion – If a student is in a current status of "Warning" and at the end of the enrollment period (semester) fails to meet the standard for Completion, the student will automatically be placed on financial aid suspension and will no longer be eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

SGPPC

Suspension GPA & Percent Completion – If a student is in a current status of "Warning" and at the end of the enrollment period (semester) fails to meet the standard for GPA **and** Completion, the student will automatically be placed on financial aid suspension and will no longer be eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

SMAX

Student Exceeds Maximum Hours - Student has exceeded the allowable 150% of the published length of their degree or certificate program. Students who exceed max hours are no longer eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

SMGP

Suspension GPA & Exceeds Maximum Hours – A student who has failed to meet the GPA standard **and** has exceeded max hours. Students in this category are automatically placed on financial aid suspension and will no longer be eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

SMPC

A student who has failed to meet the Completion standard and has exceeded max hours. Students in this category are automatically placed on financial aid suspension and will no longer be eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

SMGPPC

Suspension GPA, Completion & Exceeds Maximum Hours – A student who has failed to meet the GPA and Completion standard and has exceeded max hours. Students in this category are automatically placed on financial aid suspension and will no longer be eligible for any student aid including loans, state aid, etc.

ACADPL

Academic Plan – A student whose appeal is approved for GPA or Completion must complete an academic plan. In order to remain eligible for financial aid while on an academic plan, the student may not withdraw from any coursework and must make a grade of "C" or better in every class until the student is back in good standing.
