RESPONSIBILITY

To ensure sufficient security and protection of the students, staff, and property of the College District, the Board shall authorizeauthorizes the formation of thea College District securitypolice department and shall employ and commission peace officers.

JURISDICTION

The jurisdiction of <u>College District</u> peace officers <u>isshall include</u> all the territory<u>counties</u> in the boundaries<u>which property is owned</u>, <u>leased</u>, <u>rented</u>, <u>or otherwise under the control</u> of the College District and all property, real and personal, outside the boundaries of the College District that is owned, leased, or rented by or otherwise under the College District's control.

SECURITYPOLICE
AUTHORITYAND
POWERS

PeaceWhile within the jurisdiction set out in this policy, peace officers employed and commissioned by the College District shall have all the following powers, privileges, and immunities of peace officers while in the jurisdiction provided by this policy. Peace. College District peace officers shall have the authority to:

- Investigate and prevent violations of law, ordinances, or College District policy that occur on College District property, at school zones, and/or at College District functions; that involve College District vehicles, equipment or buses; or that involve offenses against the College District or against College District staff or Board members in their capacity as College District staff or Board members;
- Serve Protect the safety and welfare of any person in the jurisdiction of the College District and protect the property of the College District.
- 2. Enforce all laws, including municipal ordinances, county ordinances, and state laws, and investigate violations of law as needed. In doing so, College District police officers may serve search warrants and arrest warrants in connection with College District-related investigations;
- 3.2. Take juveniles into custody as provided by in compliance with the FamilyTexas Code; of Criminal Procedure.
- 4.3. Arrest suspects consistent with state and federal statutory and constitutional standards governing arrests, including arrests without warrant, for felonies and breaches of the peaceoffenses that occur in the officer's presence within or under the other rules set out in the jurisdiction of the College District; Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 5. Patrol campuses (not streets) in connection with the performance of duties provided by this policy;
- 6. Engage in activities and programs approved by the director of safety and security designed to prevent or deter crimes

- against College District property or College District staff, students, and visitors;
- 7. Carry weapons as directed by the director of safety and security;
- 8. Assist in providing traffic and parking control at athletic events, at campus openings or closings, or at any other time deemed necessary by the director of safety and security to ensure the safety and welfare of students, staff, and College District patrons;
- 9.4. Where appropriate, coordinate Coordinate and cooperate with commissioned officers of all other law enforcement agencies in the enforcement of this policy; as necessary.
- 5. Enforce College District policies on College District property or at College District functions.
- 10.6. Investigate violations of College District <u>policy</u>, rules, and regulations as requested by the College District administration <u>District President</u> and participate in administrative hearings concerning the alleged violations;.
- 11. Participate in judicial proceedings; and
- 12. Apprehend suspects consistent with this policy.

RACIAL PROFILING

- 7. Peace officers employed by the College District shall not initiate any law enforcement action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin. The director Carry weapons as directed by the chief of safetypolice and securityapproved by the District President.
- 8. Carry out all other duties as directed by the chief of police or District President.

TEMPORARY ASSIGNMENT

College District police officers shall developenforce all laws, including municipal ordinances, county ordinances, and implement rulesstate laws within another law enforcement agency's jurisdiction while temporarily assigned to ensure compliance with Articles 2.131 through 2.138, Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedurethe other agency.

LIMITATION LIMITATION

S ON OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT

No officer commissioned under this policy may wear or use the College District security uniform or badge or shall provide law enforcement or security services while working for an outside employer unless without prior written approval is received by the director of safety and security and the vice president of administration, as approved by the College President from the chief of police and District President or designee. See DFB(Local) for additional requirements related to non-school employment.

RELATIONSHIP WITH OUTSIDE AGENCIES

The director of safety and securityThe College District's police department and the law enforcement agencies with which it has overlapping jurisdiction shall enter into a memorandum of understanding that outlines reasonable communication and coordination efforts among all the department and the agencies or departments with overlapping jurisdiction. The directorchief of safety and securitypolice and the vice president of administration District President or designee shall review the memorandum of understanding at least once every year. The memorandum of understanding shall be presented to the College President for review and recommendation to approved by the Board.

USE OF FORCE

The use of force, including deadly force, shall be authorized only when reasonable and necessary. The use of excessive force is expressly forbidden, as outlined in the department regulations manual.

HOTHIGH-SPEED PURSUIT While under the jurisdiction provided by this policy, officers Officers shall not engage in high-speed chases or the hot pursuit of suspected offenders in a motor vehicle when the immediate danger to the public or the officer created by the pursuit exceeds the immediate or potential danger presented by the offender's remaining at large. Officers shall suspend a pursuit whenever the risk to the public exceeds the immediate or potential danger of the offender remaining at large. While outside the jurisdiction provided by this policy, no officer shall initiate or participate in the hot pursuit of a suspected offender offenders remaining at large. Guidelines for high-speed pursuits shall be addressed in the department regulations manual.

VIDEO MONITORING

<u>Video equipment shall be used on a College District police car for safety purposes whenever the flashing lights on a car are in use.</u>

ACCESS TO RECORDINGS

Recordings shall be considered law enforcement records, shall remain in the custody of the chief of police, and shall be maintained as required by the department regulations manual and law.

OFFICER TRAINING

All College District officers shall receive at least 40 hoursthe minimum amount of continuing education and firearms training each year. The training shall be approved TCLEOSE required by law.

DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS MANUAL To carry out the provisions in this policy, the police department shall compile and include training in civil rights, racial sensitivity, cultural diversity, and recognition of cases maintain a manual that involve child abuse, child neglect, family violence describes and sets forth operational procedures, rules, and regulations pertaining to the administration of police services. The chief of police and the District President or designee shall review the manual annually and make any appropriate revisions.
