



# ATI Remote Proctoring with Proctorio

## What is its purpose?

ATI is partnering with Proctorio to virtually proctor assessments. Proctorio is a remote proctoring platform that uses machine learning to proctor students from wherever they may be. Proctorio offers a variety of secure exam settings including video, audio, and screen recording designed to maintain the integrity of the assessment and ensure uncompromised exam results.

## Technical requirements

- Microphone: Any microphone, either internal or external
- Webcam: 320x240 VGA resolution (minimum) internal or external
- Proctorio Google Chrome extension will need to be installed on device

## Setting students up for success

In order to provide the best experience for you and your students, we recommend administering a dry run test before an ATI assessment. **IMPORTANT: Conduct this dry run exam at least one or two days prior to the ATI assessment. Treat this dry run as you would a normal proctored assessment.** You can administer the dry run using the following directions:

- Log into your faculty account at [atitesting.com/educator](https://atitesting.com/educator).
- Navigate to proctor monitoring experience
- The dry run assessment is located under 'No Cohort/Group Assigned'. Please provide the assessment ID to your students.
- Enable 'ATI Remote Proctoring with Proctorio Dry Run' for the cohort
- Check in and accept students
- Monitor students during exam
- Close proctor monitoring experience

## Proctor experience

As a proctor, nothing will change to your experience when administering an exam using Proctorio. You will still be required to enable the assessment and approve test takers as you normally do. You may use the new proctor monitoring experience or the classic version.

## Assessment scheduling

Using this new solution, there are no blackout dates or restrictions to scheduling a proctored assessment. This gives you the flexibility to schedule and proctor an exam at your preferred time.

## Recording features

Each test taker will agree to the use of their device's audio and video. The proctor will not have access to audio or video during or after the exam. A record of the following will be kept by ATI's Test Security team and will be reviewed if abnormalities are detected during the exam.

- Video record of test taker during exam to ensure test environment is secure
- Audio record of test taker to ensure no verbal cues are provided
- Screen and web traffic record of device during exam

## Browser security features

A student can expect the following security measures during each assessment.

- Browser lockdown (force full screen, no additional applications open, only one displayed allowed, print/print screen, and clipboard disabled)
- Download capabilities blocked
- Right click disabled during exam
- Room scan required to assess condition of environment
- Validation and authorization for re-entry required if kicked out of exam

## Test taker verification and system diagnostic test

Each student will go through a system diagnostic test and test taker verification prior to taking an assessment, which will require the following:

- Desktop screen share
- E-Signature
- Student or government-issued ID
- Webcam
- Audio
- Internet connection
