The Consortium Agreement will permit Franklin to package the financial aid for the 3rd year Bridge (B) Courses and allow for a maximum of 94 hours to be taken at the community college tuition rate, all applying towards the hours needed for the completion of the Bachelor's Degree at Franklin.
